

# What is Harvard Model Congress?

# Government Activity Run by Harvard Students


- Focused on American government and international organizations.
- Delegates get a firsthand view of how policy change is made on a small-scale.

### Committee-Based

- Delegates are sorted into committees are based on real-life bodies, such as committees of American Congress, where legislation is drafted.
- They are then assigned to represent a person or a country.

# Emphasis on Collaboration and Education

- Delegates are expected to collaborate with other students in writing and presenting bills.
- Delegates are expected to debate and then write bills or resolutions at conference, support materials are available on the delegate portal.





# Substantive and Policy-Based

- Debate is organized around two briefings, background guides that are released pre-conference.
- Committees are chaired by Harvard undergraduate students who guide debate and bill writing and provide personalized support and feedback to delegates.

# UNITED NATIONS SECURITY COUNCIL

The United Nations Security Council is one of the six principal bodies of the United Nations. The UNSC is tasked with maintaining international peace and security. To do this, the UNSC has the power to take decisive actions, including establishing economic sanctions, creating peacekeeping missions, and authorizing military action.



The World Health Organization is a specialized agency of the United Nations, focused on public health. Established in 1948, the WHO has been instrumental in gathering and synthesizing data about international health problems. They have tackled a number of important health issues, including communicable and noncommunicable diseases, nutrition, and the eradication of smallpox.





### **SENATE HOMELAND SECURITY**

The United States Senate
Committee on Homeland Security
and Governmental Affairs is the
head oversight committee in the
U.S. Senate. It exercises oversight
over the Department of Homeland
Security, as well as all other
homeland security concerns.
Senate Homeland Security also has
jurisdiction over the functioning of
the government, including the
National Archives, budgets other
than appropriations, the census,
the federal civil service, and the
postal service.

### **HOUSE JUDICIARY**

The Committee on the Judiciary has jurisdiction over matters relating to the administration of justice in federal courts, administrative bodies, and law enforcement agencies. This includes a range of issues such as bankruptcy, espionage, the protection of civil I

### **WORLD BANK**

The World Bank is a financial institution associated with the United Nations. Their official goal is reducing poverty, and they have attempted to do so through a number of initiatives, including loans to the poorest countries, raising money for food security, and creating financial education programs.

### **Aya Faiz**


### Director of Diversity, Equity, Inclusion, and Belonging
